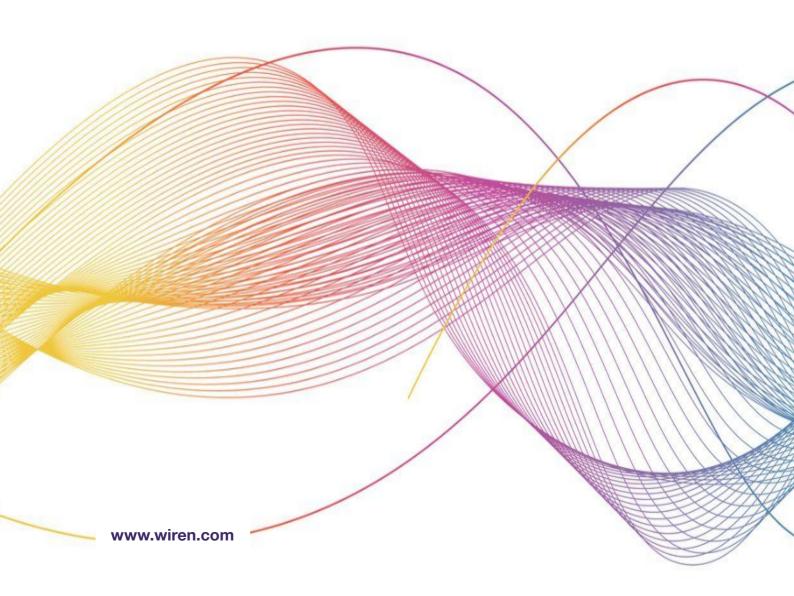

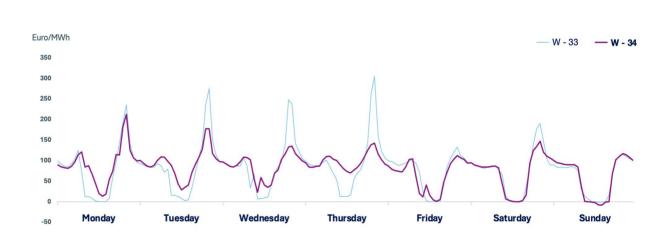

Romania closed the week with an average price of **81,17 €/MWh**, holding a middle position in the regional landscape: **above Bulgaria and slightly behind Hungary.** The slight increase masked a downward shift compared to the previous weeks, placing Romania among the most notable decreases across the continent.

The **Southeast saw a coordinated drop**, with Romania, Greece, Bulgaria, and North Macedonia all registering decreases near or above **37**%. The Nordic region flipped direction entirely, led by Finland, where prices increased **more than fourteenfold.**

Hourly Prices



The highest hourly price of the week was recorded on **Monday, August 18**, at **9 p.m.**, reaching **212,78 €/MWh**. Several countries in Central and Eastern Europe registered their weekly maximums during the same interval, **in line with** a shared moment of elevated market intensity across the region.

On Sunday, August 24, at 2 p.m., the country once again aligned with a broader European pattern, this time at the opposite end of the price range. The same interval marked the weekly minimum in nearly half of Europe's markets, with Romania registering an hourly value of -7,45 €/MWh.

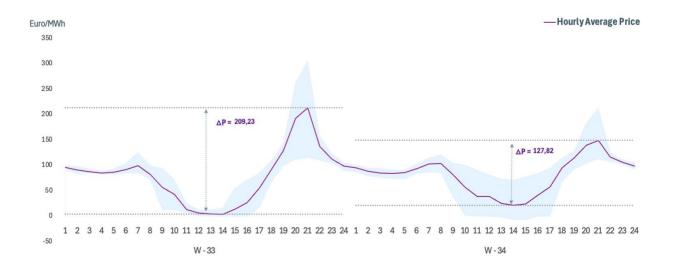

The weekly average of 81,17 €/MWh reflects a blend of two distinct phases: **higher** weekday levels, at 87,18 €/MWh, and a softer weekend performance, closing at 66,14 €/MWh.

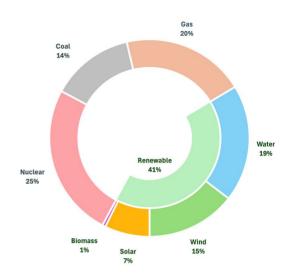


Romania's market moved within a tighter interval, with the difference between hourly highs and lows falling to 127,82 €/MWh, well below last week's 209,23 €/MWh.



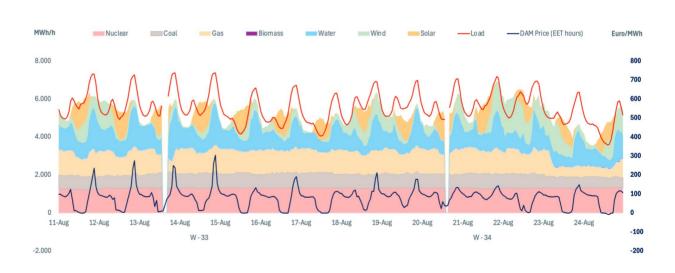

The chart above reflects a **stable national energy landscape**: both **production** and **consumption** remained relatively **close to last week's levels**.

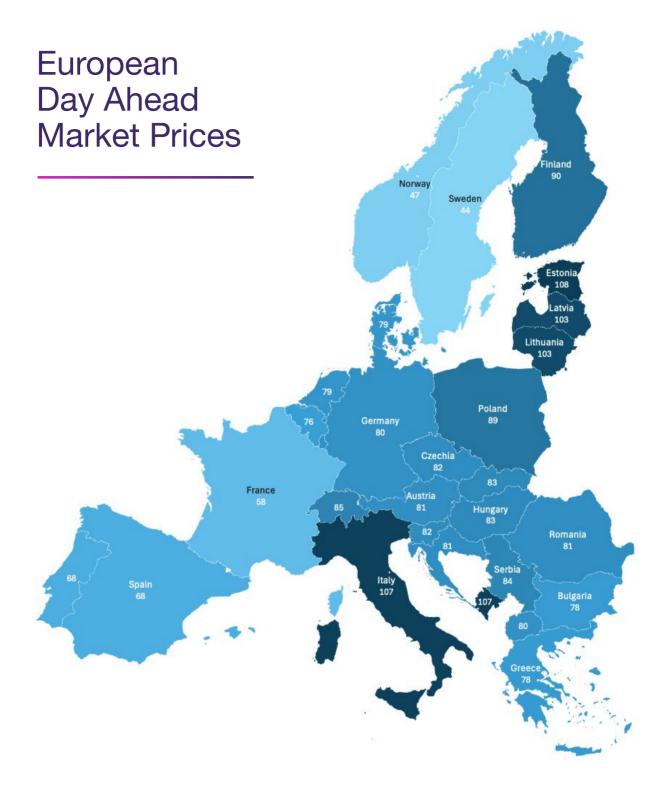
Hourly Generation



Wind power stood out with the most significant movement, **doubling its output compared to the previous week** and rising to one of the most consistent contributors in the daily profile.

Hydropower registered its weakest weekly performance in recent years, potentially marking a historical low for the 2019-2025 interval. Alongside hydro, solar and gas-fired generation also declined, adding to the structural shifts within the national energy mix.





While more than 60% of countries registered declines, the continental spot price average edged up by 3%, reaching 82 €/MWh.

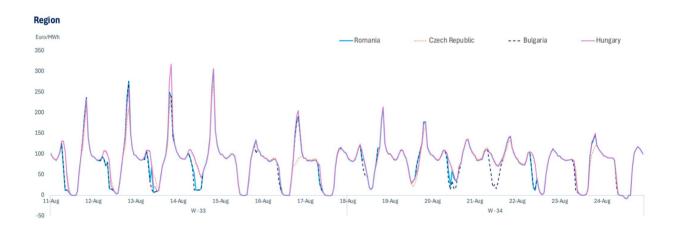
Decreases defined the Southwest: **Portugal** and **Spain** fell by **18%**, and **France** by **12%**. The **Nordic and Baltic regions reversed course**, with increases in **Finland** (+79%), **Estonia** (+47%), and **Sweden** (+42%). Weather conditions, especially **reduced wind availability**, curtailed wind generation in the north, pushing up prices in Scandinavia and the Baltics.

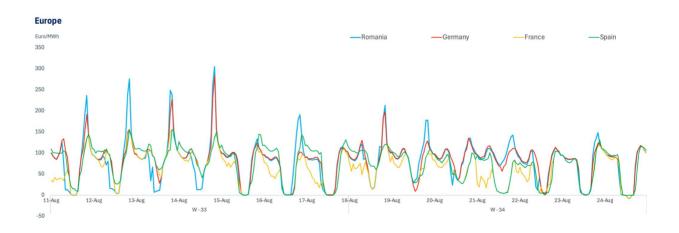
As a result, Estonia recorded the highest average price in Europe (108 €/MWh), followed by Lithuania and Latvia (103 €/MWh) and Finland (90 €/MWh). Italy and Montenegro remained above the 100 €/MWh level, while Sweden (44 €/MWh) and Norway (47 €/MWh) continued to register the lowest averages.
